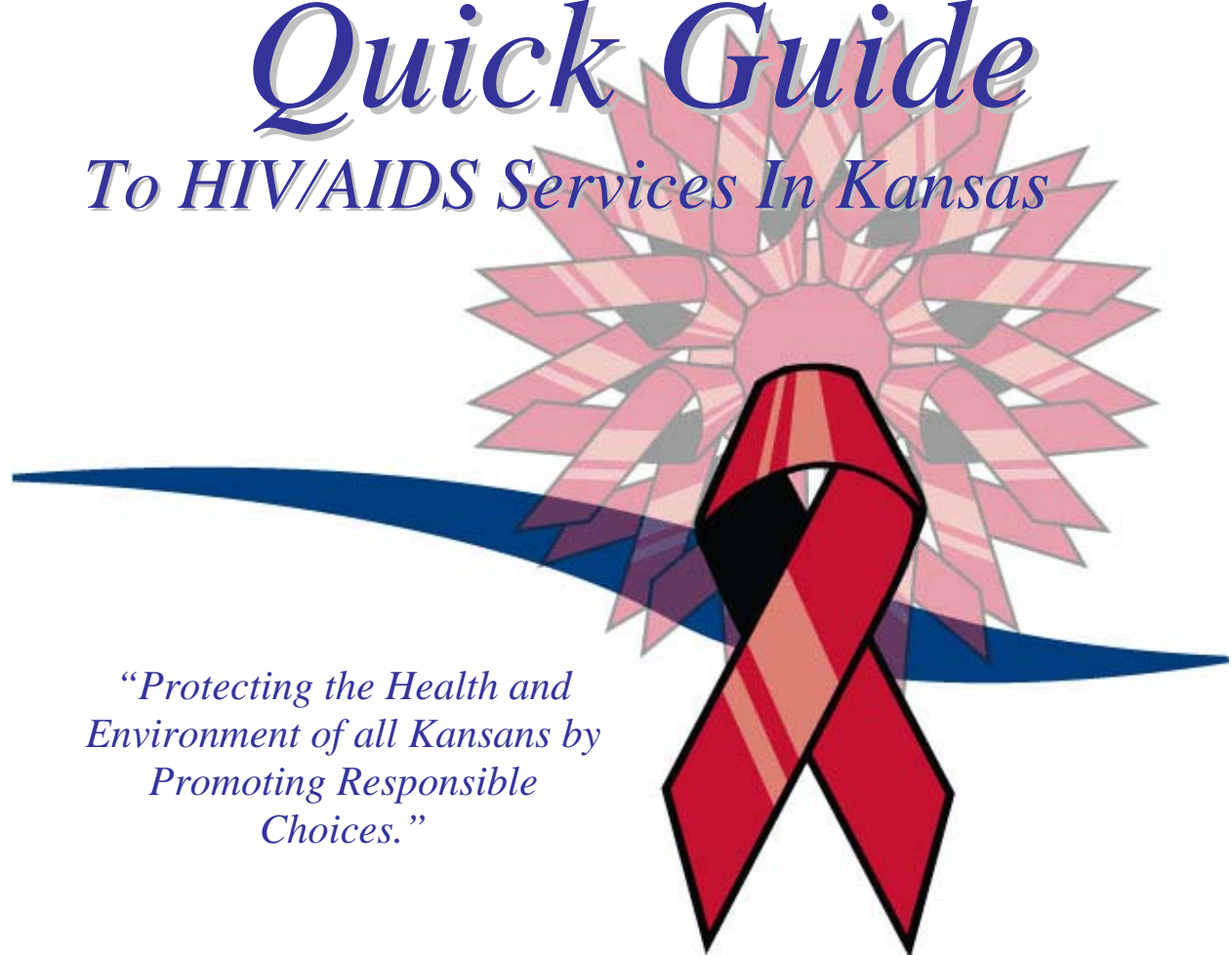

KANSAS DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND ENVIRONMENT FUNDED PROGRAMS

The HIV/AIDS Program, administered by the Bureau of Disease Control and Prevention (BDPC) under the Kansas Department of Health and Environment (KDHE), helps provide education, counseling and testing programs that reach 80,000 Kansans each year. The program annually trains more than 200 counselors and educators, and supervises 170 care and prevention agreements.

The mission of the HIV/AIDS Program is to promote public health and enhance the quality of life for Kansas's residents by the prevention, intervention, and treatment of HIV/AIDS. The mission will be accomplished through policy and resource development, clinical data collection and analysis, research, education, community planning, prevention programs, disease detection, and the provision of treatment and clinical care services.

This guide is **NOT** intended to be a comprehensive listing of services. It is intended to provide interested individuals and organizations with information regarding core agencies involved in the effort to combat HIV/AIDS. Some programs listed are funded by KDHE. RYAN WHITE PART B CASE MANAGEMENT AND CARE COORDINATION

Case Management is an approach to non-emergency HIV-related service delivery that is client-centered and community-minded. These services are comprehensive in scope and provide a means to enhance the quality of life for people affected by HIV. At the same time, case management is a system of need and utilization assessment that helps local communities plan and allocate resources. COMMUNITY PLANNING FOR HIV PREVENTION

In 1994, the HIV/AIDS Section began the process of participatory community planning, using funds provided by the CDC. HIV/AIDS prevention community planning refers to an ongoing process whereby KDHE and representatives/members of communities and populations at risk for HIV/AIDS infection set priorities and develop goals designed to promote effective HIV/AIDS prevention programming. In Kansas, the Community Planning Group (CPG) serves as a voice for those communities that are at highest risk for contracting HIV. The CPG contributes significantly by advising the HIV/AIDS Program on how to best implement culturally competent and sensitive HIV/AIDS prevention services to those who need them most. COUNSELING AND TESTING

The primary goal of CTR is to provide HIV/AIDS prevention counseling, testing, referral, and partner counseling and referral services for Kansans who are HIV-infected and/or engaging in behaviors that raise their risk for contracting HIV. The CTR program is funded by HIV/AIDS prevention monies, which come from the CDC and the State's general fund. KDHE currently performs tests for 92 HIV CTR sites serving those who are at-risk for contracting HIV. 51 CTR sites are within local health departments, many of which extend related services to sexually transmitted disease, family planning, prenatal, tuberculosis, and

other clinics. 14 CTR sites are correctional facilities and youth centers, and the remaining CTR sites include universities, family planning clinics, and drug treatment centers. CTR sites provide services for clients who voluntarily choose to be counseled and tested for HIV antibodies, except under specific circumstances as mandated by law. Additionally the CTR program has implemented opt-out testing at all KDHE-sponsored testing sites that offer prenatal services, and in 5 stand-alone STD clinics in Kansas, which will continue throughout 2009. Risk Codes are no longer used to assess an individual's risk behavior. Opt-out HIV testing is performed after notifying the patient that the test will be performed and the patient may elect to decline or defer testing. Consent is inferred unless the patient declines testing. Kansas's law requires the availability of anonymous (no name/personal identifiers) testing throughout the state. Following this charge, KDHE has made anonymous testing available at all of the 77 public CTR sites, which are within a 100-mile radius of any Kansas resident. All CTR sites are held to strict confidentiality requirements. Venipuncture/blood draw testing is offered through all CTR sites with the exception of the 7 Outreach testing sites. Clearview HIV ½ Rapid Testing, which provides a preliminary result in 15 minutes, is used for both clinic based and outreach testing efforts. OraSure/oral mucosal transudate testing is done on a confidential basis through 16 CTR sites.

LINKAGE TO CARE PROGRAM

In 2009, the HIV/AIDS Section added The Linkage to Care program. The Linkage to care program is strengths-based care coordination for individuals that are newly diagnosed with HIV. The goal of the program is to link individuals who are diagnosed with HIV to medical care. This program utilizes federal, state, and community based resources to provide services and support based on each individual's need. This program is designed to work with the Kansas Ryan White Case Management system to provide ongoing services and support once the client is engaged in medical care. HIV PREVENTION PROGRAM

The focus and strategies of HIV prevention efforts continue to change in response to shifting needs of individuals and communities across Kansas. Simply stated, the goal of this program is to reduce the spread of HIV infection in the state of Kansas. To accomplish this goal, the HIV/AIDS Section contracts with County Health Departments (CHD) and Community-Based Organizations (CBO) to implement front line HIV prevention and risk reduction interventions throughout Kansas (e.g., street outreach, workshops, trainings, presentations). These interventions target populations experiencing the highest number and rates of infection, and are designed to be age/gender appropriate, linguistically specific, and culturally sensitive. Interventions are organized around 1) helping individuals, groups, or social networks identify and change their attitudes, beliefs, and behaviors that contribute to the transmission of HIV; 2) decreasing anxiety about HIV disease and misconceptions about transmission; and 3) disseminating HIV prevention and risk reduction information in a manner that is personally meaningful and facilitates the reduction of HIV transmission. While providing ongoing technical assistance to all KDHE-funded HIV prevention contractors, the HIV/STD Section also oversees the activities of these agencies and evaluates their effectiveness.

RESOURCES FOR PERSONS LIVING WITH HIV/AIDS

CARE AND SUPPORT SERVICES FOR HIV-POSITIVE KANSANS:

The primary goal of the Ryan White Part B Program and AIDS Drug Assistance (ADAP) Program is to provide care services to persons living with HIV infection and AIDS in the State of Kansas. The principal source of funding for the provision of HIV care for the un- and under-insured is through the Ryan White HIV/AIDS Treatment Modernization Act of 2006 (Formerly known as the Ryan White CARE Act).. The Modernization Act of 2006 provides the Federal HIV/AIDS programs in the Public Health Service (PHS) Act under Title XXV flexibility to respond effectively to the changing epidemic. The Ryan White HIV/AIDS Treatment Modernization Act of 2006's main focus is to create a nationwide system of delivery for care services for persons living with HIV infection who have no other or limited access to services. Individuals qualify for such services by submitting an application through a contracted Kansas Ryan White Part B Case Manager. Eligible clients then enter the KDHE's Ryan White Part B Program system of services.

The care delivery system is provided through contractors with KDHE. The types of providers we contract with are defined by the types of services of which the Ryan White Program provides. In 2006, the Health Resources Services Administration (HRSA) HIV/AIDS Bureau (HAB) identified five core services by which states must ensure funding. Those five core services, listed alphabetically and not by priority, are:

- Case Management;
- HIV Related Medications through the statewide ADAP;
- Mental Health Treatment;
- Oral Health;
- Primary Medical Care consistent with PHS Treatment Guidelines; and
- Substance Abuse Treatment.

AIDS DRUG ASSISTANCE PROGRAM (ADAP):

This program assists eligible clients in the purchase of medications for treatment of HIV/AIDS by reimbursing contracted Medicaid pharmacies. Originally administered through the KDHE, this program was moved into the Kansas Health Policy Authority (KHPA) for payment and dispensing only. Eligibility of services is still maintained through the KDHE contracted providers. This collaboration of services and statewide programs has allowed for a more accessible service delivery system. Medications covered through the ADAP are listed on the Ryan White Part B Drug Formulary located on the KDHE website at: www.kdheks.gov/hiv/download/adap_formulary.pdf.

In 2000, the statewide ADAP began assisting clients who were on a predetermined Medicaid Spenddown (out of pocket) expense. This was done through state assistance to the ADAP in order to expedite clients into the Medicaid system. This process allows clients to access statewide programs sooner reflecting reduced cost to the ADAP.

Finally, in 2006, the statewide ADAP expanded its delivery of services to include health insurance premiums. Although the program has historically served individuals with co-payments on formulary medications, this new service was provided to ensure adequate funding for direct care services. Additionally, premium determination is made on the utilization of medications. This simple cost saving plan would relieve the statewide ADAP of higher costs if the consumer did not have or maintain their health insurance.

CASE MANAGEMENT AND CARE COORDINATION:

Case Management and Care Coordination is a system for ensuring a comprehensive program that will meet an individual’s need for services by coordinating and linking the components of a service delivery system.

Case management assesses the individuals need for services; determines the availability and feasibility of services; develops a plan of care that includes home and community-based services appropriate to the individuals medical, social, and financial condition; arranges for service delivery; monitors service delivery; maintains confidentiality of client records within the service delivery system; and conducts ongoing evaluation of the effectiveness of the plan of care. Most sites also receive funds to assist individuals with transportation, emergency needs, legal advocacy and food bank/home-delivered meals. DENTAL CARE SERVICES:

HEALTH EDUCATION/RISK REDUCTION INTERVENTIONS:

KDHE, in collaboration with the Kansas HIV Prevention Planning Group, plans and manages prevention interventions designed to help individuals engaging in activities that carry a high risk of HIV/STD infection. The purpose of these interventions is to prevent the acquisition or transmission of HIV, reduce the incidence of opportunistic infections or other STDs, and slow the progression of HIV to AIDS. Interventions may be Individual Level, Group Level, Community Outreach or Prevention Case Management. HE/RR contractors conduct Health Communication/Public Information campaigns involving electronic media, print media, and lectures. Contractors also provide referrals for other social service needs and distribute literature and materials such as condoms, lubricant, and bleach kits. HOUSING OPPORTUNITIES FOR PEOPLE WITH AIDS (HOPWA)

Kansas Care Through Housing is a Housing Opportunities for People With AIDS (HOPWA) funded program through the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). The program is contracted through the University Of Kansas School Of Medicine - Wichita Medical Practice Association, a non-profit organization. The funds are granted through The Kansas Department of Health and Environment (KDHE). All guidelines established are in compliance with HUD and HOPWA. Assistance is provided regardless of race, religion, color, sex, sexual preference, disability, veteran status, national origin or ancestry. KANSAS HEALTH INSURANCE ASSISTANCE (KHIA) PROGRAM:

Through this program, KDHE pays premiums for medical and dental insurance coverage held by eligible individuals. Participants in this program must have insurance coverage in place at the time of application and have found that the coverage is a cost-savings measure to the Kansas Ryan White Program. KDHE may also pay prescription co-pays/deductibles; however, eligibility for this program is based on a case-by-case basis.

KANSAS RYAN WHITE PART B ADVISORY PLANNING BODY:

The Kansas Ryan White Part B Planning Body serves as an advisory group and planning body for HIV-related health and human services, promotes greater cooperation among all agencies in Kansas delivering HIV-related health and human services, solves problems collaboratively regarding the major issues in HIV-related health, human service and quality of life for the state of Kansas, develops and maintains an advocacy capacity for HIV-related services, provides HIV-related health and human service information to community providers and residents in order to increase accessibility and visibility of services and monitor implementation plans developed by the coalition and evaluate services provided. The advisory consortium consists of Ryan White Part B and Part C providers, local agency representatives, individuals infected and affected by HIV and those interested in participating in the development and enhancement of those efforts.

MENTAL HEALTH/SUBSTANCE ABUSE SERVICES:

This program reimburses contracted Ryan White Part B facilities and therapists for authorized services. Services offered are substance abuse outpatient treatment and HIV/AIDS-related mental health treatment.

PARTNER COUNSELING AND REFERRAL SERVICES (PCRS):

Counseling of sex and needle-sharing partners is offered to all people testing positive for HIV. Contact (785) 296-8596.

PRIMARY CARE/EARLY INTERVENTION SERVICES:

This program reimburses contracted Ryan White Part B clinics and physicians for physician and nurse visits, diagnostic tests, and minor in-office procedures. In order ensure and maintain a quality of care for those needing primary care services, the program works with the Kansas AIDS Education Training Center (KAETC). The KAETC provides training for physicians, nurses, dentists and dental hygienists. This activity helps to ensure that providers are following the required Public Health Services (PHS) Guidelines for the Treatment of Persons Living with HIV/AIDS. Reimbursement for these services is done at the Medicaid rate at the time of service.

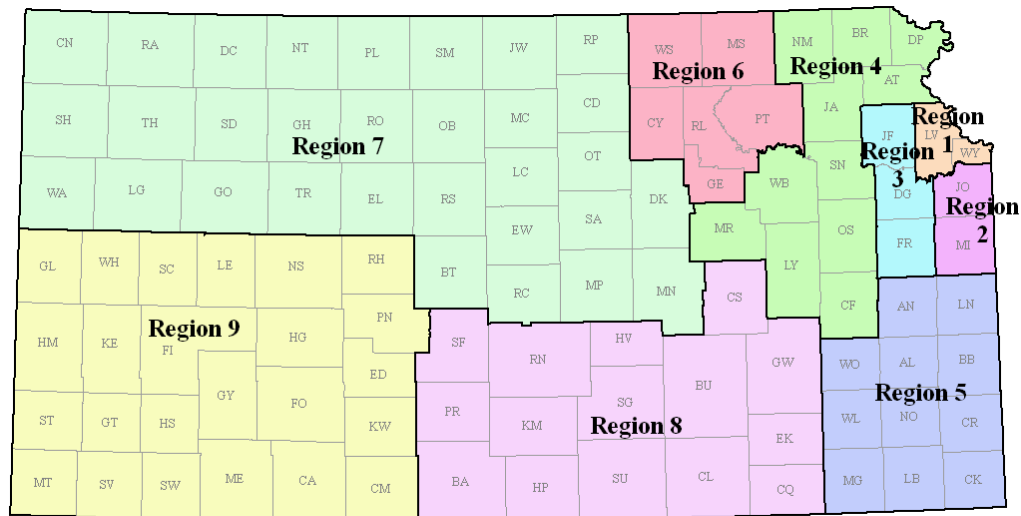
